WHAT IS A YEARLONG ROADMAP?

It answers the question, "What does my child need to learn in math this year?" by:

- Listing all of the standards for your child's grade.
- Pointing out the big ideas.
- Providing definitions of key vocabulary words.

Knowing this can help you support your child's learning at home.

HOW CAN YOU USE A YEARLONG ROADMAP?

Here are a couple of ways that you can use the roadmap:

1

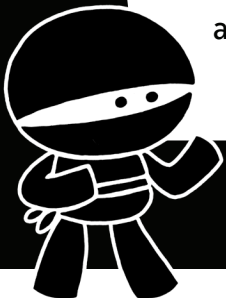
Follow along with your child's learning.

Look for the standard number on your child's school work and put a check mark or a sticky note next to the standard that he/she is currently working on at school. This allows you to identify which standards your child is learning and what he/she should be able to do for that concept.

2

Build your child's math vocabulary.

Use the back of the roadmap to become familiar with words that you can use with your child at home or when helping with their homework. For example, "What is the sum of $9 + 8$?"
